

# **National Trust Cottages Accessibility Guide**

Killerton Park Cottage Killerton Devon EX5 3LE

### Introduction

Killerton Park Cottage is set within the grounds of the Killerton Estate, it backs onto the estate. It is a former lodge house. It is a 2 bedroom detached property set within a large landscaped garden with a patio area.

The Cottage is arranged as follows:

#### **Ground Floor:**

 There is an entrance lobby which leads into the dining area, this leads to the sitting room, stairway and kitchen. There is also a rear door to the cottage

#### First Floor:

There is a large bathroom, 2 bedrooms - 1 king-size and 1 twin room

## **Approach**

- The cottage is approached from the main car park area,
- There is automatic lighting to the entrance to the cottage at night

# **Arrival & Parking Facilities**

• There is a reserved parking space outside the garden to the cottage

# Getting in (and out) of the cottage

The cottage is accessed through a spring loaded wooden gate, over a gravel walkway which leads to 5 brick steps there are no hand rails to these steps. There is an alternative route up a slope to the brick paved terrace the front door is located on the brick terrace. There is a drop of 520mm from the raised brick terrace to the grass below this is unguarded.

## Getting around the cottage

### **Ground floor:**

- The entrance porch doorway is 780mm wide, there is a step up into the porch of 140mm.
- There is a further step up into the dining room from the porch of 210mm, there is a wooden threshold strip in this door way.
- The flooring on the porch is covered in coir matting.



- The porch has a light which is operated by a PIR switch.
- The key safe is on the main wall of the house to the left of the porch and is 1500mm from the ground.
- The mortice lock for the front door is 930mm from the ground. The internal porch door is 770mm wide.
- The dining room and kitchen floors are tiled with quarry tiles
- The sitting room has painted floorboards with a large rug.
- The staircase has a central carpet runner on it, there are two turns in the stairs

#### First floor:

- The landing is carpeted as are the two bedrooms
- The bathroom has painted wooden floor boards

### Kitchen

- The door way leading to the kitchen is 730mm wide
- Height of worktop is 920mm, there are units fitted to two opposite walls in the kitchen.
- There are wall cupboards above the kitchen units.
- The kitchen has a fridge with integral ice box, a washer/dryer behind a door, an integrated dish washer and a double oven electric cooker.

## **Sitting Room**

- The entrance is 770mm wide
- There is one sofa 2.5 seater, 2 chairs and a window seat
- The height to sofa seat is 460mm, depth 620mm
- The high back armchairs have a seat height of 480mm and 540mm depth
- Window seat is 530mm height by 450mm deep, this seat has views over parkland
- There is one radiator and a woodburning stove
- There is a wall mounted combined TV/DVD unit, there is a remote control for this.
- There is a large occasional table 500mm height
- There is an overhead light, two wall lights and two table lamps

## **Dining Room**

- The dining table is capable of accommodating six guests, the table is 730mm to top of table,
- The chairs are wooden with a seat pad and the height to the pad is 520mm, gap between top of chair and base of table is 200mm.
- There are two overhead lights directly over the table, and two spotlights to light the rest of the room
- There is a radiator in this room



#### First Floor

#### Stair case

- The width of the staircase is 830mm, there are fourteen steps, the rise is 190mm high.
- Average width of tread is 230mm. Three treads go from 230mm to nothing. There is a wooden handrail to the right of the stairs when ascending.
- There is a hanging light in the lower hall and landing.
- There is a window at the top of the stairs.

### Twin Bedroom

- Entrance door width is 730mm
- Bed height is 650mm, bed width is 890mm wide. These beds can only be used as single beds
- There is a bedside lamp and two wall lights, a chair and built in wardrobe.
- The window cill height is 730mm.
- There is a radiator in this room.

### **Double Bedroom**

- Entrance door width is 730mm
- Bed height is 630mm, bed width is 1630 wide, these beds can be offered as two singles, on request.
- There is a window seat with a height of 500mm and 460mm deep
- There are two wall lights and two bedside lamps
- There are three windows in this room and the height of the window sill is a minimum of 610mm.
- There is a radiator in this room.

#### **Bathroom**

- Entrance door 740mm wide
- Feature roll top bath 640mm to top of bath, internal dimensions 640mm wide by
- 1450mm long. There is a fixed shower over this bath, this is enclosed by four curtains
- The W/C is 400mm to top of seat
- The washbasin is 820mm to top of basin
- All taps are crossheads
- The painted floor can be slippery when wet.
- There is a combined towel/radiator in this room.
- There are overhead downlights, and shaver point and two wall lights over the sink mirror.

#### Garden

The cottage has a large garden, which is mainly laid out to lawn, there is a large terrace laid out in brick pavers, and areas of gravel. The garden is on several levels and these are linked by steps laid from the brick pavers. There is a garden table and six chairs, a barbeque, and some seating blocks around a fire pit. There is a bench,



and the garden is surrounded with a picket fence, with hedging. Visitors using the parkland can view parts of the garden

### **Additional Information**

- Assistance dogs are welcome at all our cottages
- In the event of a fire, it is the responsibility of the guests to evacuate themselves. Vibrating fire/smoke detectors are available if requested at time of booking.

## Facilities at all cottages
