

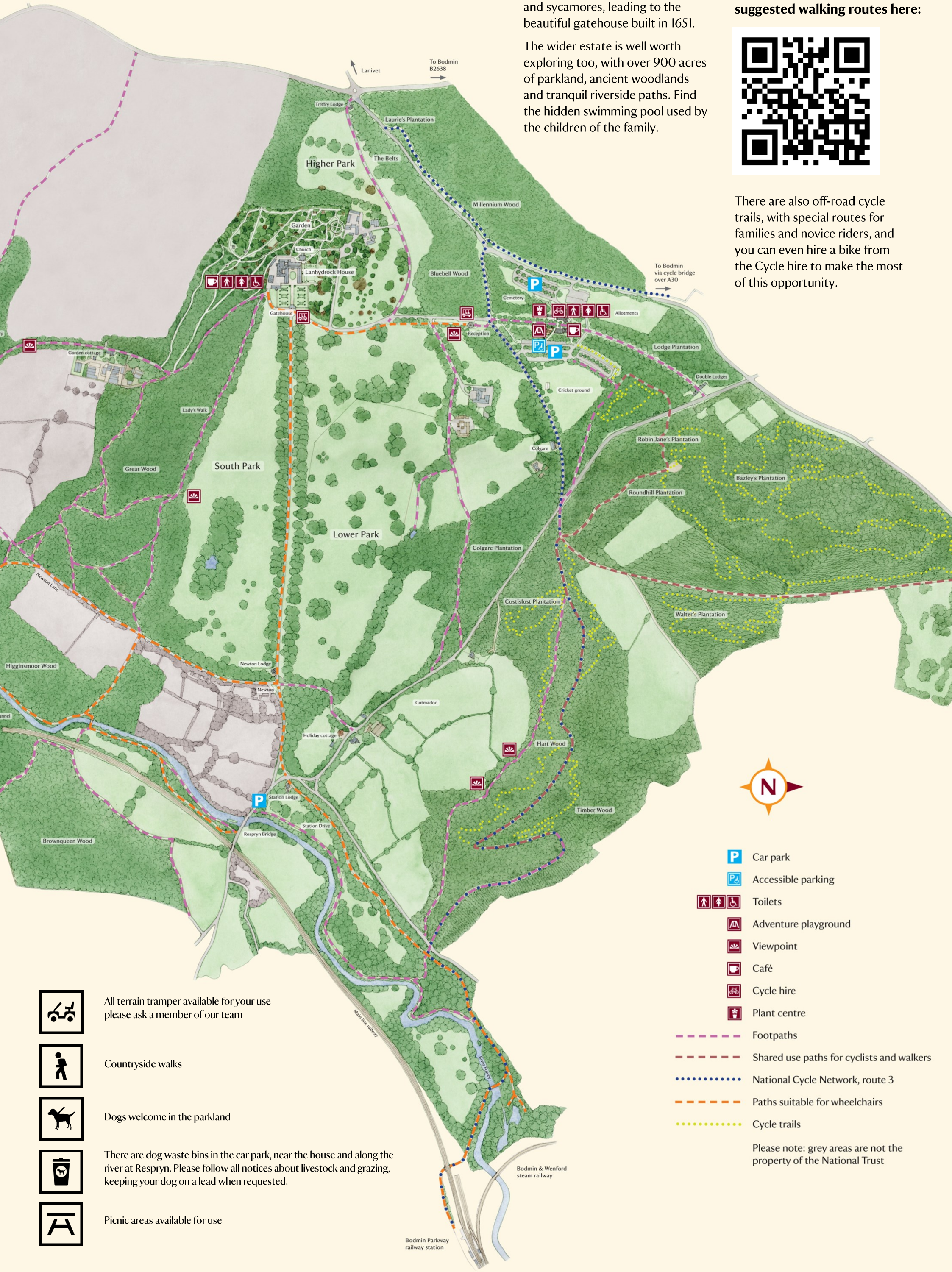
Walk between the avenue of beech and sycamores, leading to the beautiful gatehouse built in 1651.
