

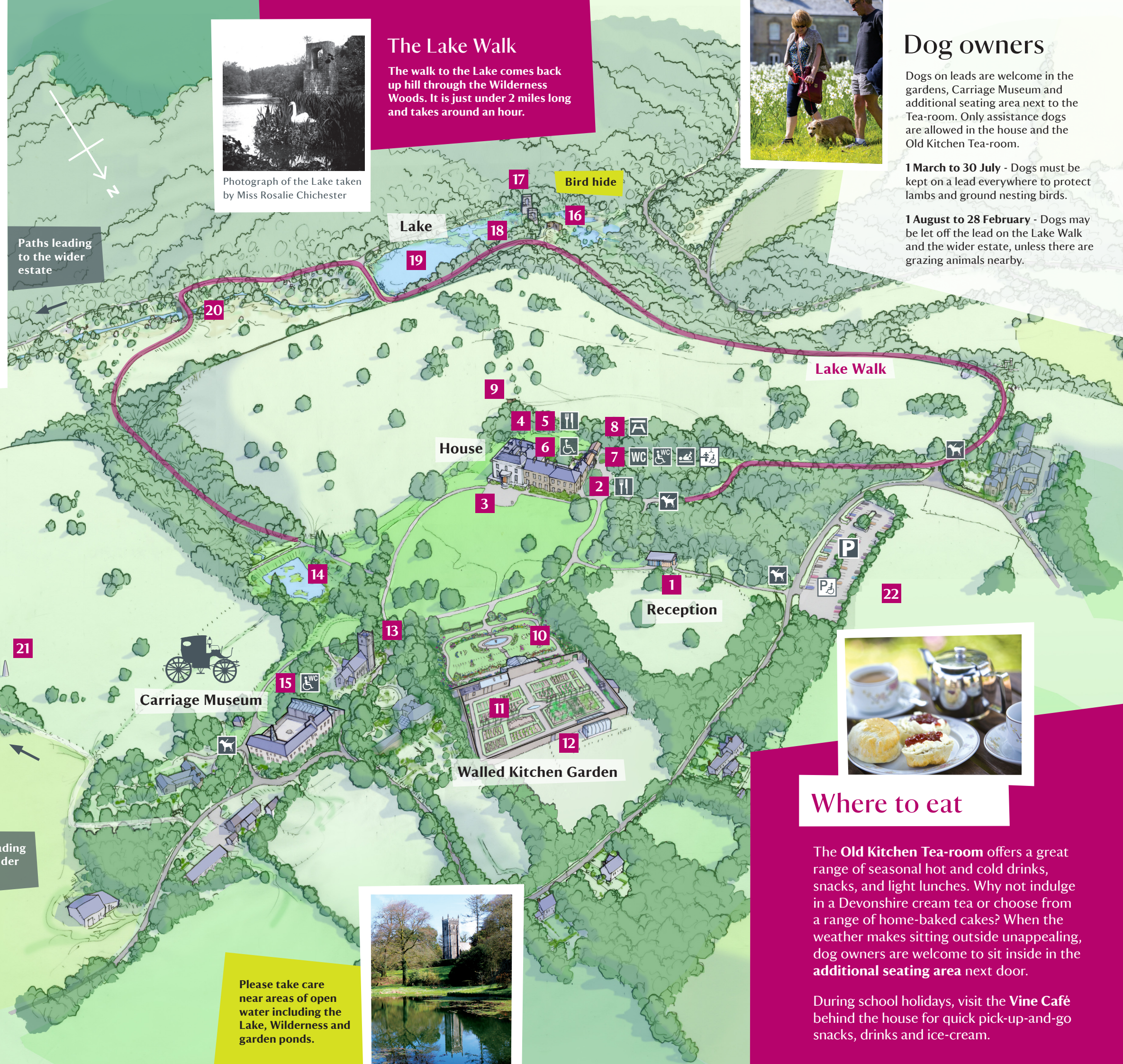


Arlington Court map

The Lake Walk

The walk to the Lake comes back up hill through the Wilderness Woods. It is just under 2 miles long and takes around an hour.

Dog owners

Dogs on leads are welcome in the gardens, Carriage Museum and additional seating area next to the Tea-room. Only assistance dogs are allowed in the house and the Old Kitchen Tea-room.

1 March to 30 July - Dogs must be kept on a lead everywhere to protect lambs and ground nesting birds.

1 August to 28 February - Dogs may be let off the lead on the Lake Walk and the wider estate, unless there are grazing animals nearby.



Where to eat

The **Old Kitchen Tea-room** offers a great range of seasonal hot and cold drinks, snacks, and light lunches. Why not indulge in a Devonshire cream tea or choose from a range of home-baked cakes? When the weather makes sitting outside unappealing, dog owners are welcome to sit inside in the **additional seating area** next door.

During school holidays, visit the **Vine Café** behind the house for quick pick-up-and-go snacks, drinks and ice-cream.
