### **Introduction**

A coastline of dramatic cliffs, open farmland and hidden sandy coves. This property is located on a headland a few miles west of Salcombe and a perfect starting point for exploring the unspoilt and isolated coast between Bolt Head and Bolt Tail.

**NB** - Mobile phone reception is sporadic across the site, however in an emergency any mobile phone can be used as it will pick up any available signal.

### **Arrival & Parking Facilities**

The car park is accessible off the road leading to East Soar after going through the village of Malborough. There are road signs directing to East Soar but not brown tourist signs. The car park is flat stone surfaced with three designated tarmacked disabled spaces. There is an overflow car park open during the main summer season which is a stone surfaced area in the adjacent field.

Orientation panel in the car park providing details about the area and waymarked route.

Blue Badge Holders can drive down the track to the farm at East Soar Outdoor Experience to use the Walker's Hut Café.

There is a payment machine at the car park. The cost to park is £3, or free for National Trust members who scan their card. Blue Badge Holders park for free.

### **WCs**

There are no public toilets in the car park area. When East Soar Outdoor Experience is open, there are toilets available and handwashing facilities.

### **Catering**

The Walker's Hut Café, located at East Soar Outdoor Experience, is accessible and provides hot drinks and cakes (National Trust tenant). Disabled parking is provided down at the farm itself. There are tables provided in the barn on a flooring of woodchips.

### **Walks**



From the car park at East Soar it is a mile long walk to the Trust's exotic clifftop garden and Edwardian house at Overbeck's. The route takes you along the stone track leading to East Soar Farm and then across grass fields and down a mud and stone slope into the woods.

Alternatively follow the stone track down into the farm to visit the walkers hut which is fully accessible. From here there are several routes which can be walked all of which are on grass or mud surfaces and on steeply sloping gradients.
