Introduction

In the centre of Chipping Campden, in the Cotswolds stands the beautiful Market Hall. Built in 1627 and surrounded by ancient houses made from local honey-coloured stone, it's easy to imagine the marketplace alive with the bustle of traders from centuries past.

No litter bins are provided inside the market hall, but some are available on nearby paths. There is good mobile reception throughout the town.

Arrival & Parking Facilities

The site is not signposted and there is no formal car park specifically for the Market Hall, however there is paid for and public parking in Chipping Campden (with designated disabled parking spaces available). The Market Hall is accessible on two sides via a slight step (from the side of the lower high street and the high street).





Care should be taken near the sides and entrances of the Market Hall as the traffic can flow quickly alongside. The Market Hall is over 400 years old, and the floor is paved with uneven stones. Additionally, the site can become slippery underfoot when wet. There are no benches inside the market hall, but a number are placed by the nearby Town Hall. There is also no internal lighting.
