

# **Ashdown Access Statement**

### Introduction

- 1. Ashdown is an extraordinary building with the appearance of a doll's house nestled in a beautiful valley on the Berkshire Downs, surrounded by woodland. It was built by an Earl, William Craven, as a house fit for the queen he loved, Queen Elizabeth of Bohemia in 1662.
- 2. Ashdown House is tenanted and access is limited to hall, staircase (100 steps ) and roof.
- 3. Access to the house is by guided tour only at 2.15, 3.15 and 4.15, for up to 25 people at a time. On busy days, timed tickets for the tours will be handed out at the gate on a first come basis and additional tour will be at 2.45 and 3.45. Pre-booking is not required except for large groups (over 10 people) who must contact us first on 01793 762209 (phone answered 9am-5pm Monday to Friday) to check if they can be accommodated.
- 4. Mobile phone reception is limited at some points throughout the estate.
- 5. Assistance dogs are welcome in the house. Dogs are permitted under close control in the woods but not in the formal gardens around the house.

# **Arrival & Parking Facilities**

- 1. Parking is available in the woodland carpark and brown signs from Ashbury will direct you there.
- 2. There are no designated spaces for disabled visitors in the main car park. The main car park is about 100 metres from the house down a tarmac then gravelled drive.
- 3. Disabled car parking is available by the house if requested in advance by phoning 01793 762209 (office open Monday to Friday 9am to 5pm). Limited to 3 vehicles.
- 4. The surface in the main car park is a mix of gravel, wood chip and grass in the overflow car park.
- 5. No buggy or wheelchairs available on site.

### **WCs**

- 1. There is one toilet available near the South Lodge next to the house (during house opening hours only).
- 2. The toilet is adapted with support handrails but isn't fully accessible.
- 3. There is no alarm cord in the toilet and the doorway is low so there is a 'Please mind your head' sign.
- 4. The historic door way is low and guite narrow
- 5. The toilet is a right-handed transfer with the rails attached to the wall are on the right hand side.)
- 6. The light switch is on the left hand side onside when you enter the toilet
- 7. There is an automatic hand drier in the toilet



## Visitor Reception/South Lodge Welcome room

- 1. The floor is historic flag stones and the is a lip on the door as you enter.
- 2. It has a level entrance.
- 3. The desk is 750mm high.
- 4. Chairs are available with armrests

#### House

- 1. It is 200 metres from the car park to the house and visitor reception.
- 2. Outside the house its sandy coloured gravel and there are 9 steps up to the front door which are uneven with metal handrails on either side.
- 3. House is tenanted and access is limited to the entrance hall, staircase (100 steps) and roof
- 4. Access into the house is via guided tour only
- 5. Group tours available but must be booked in advance on 01793 762209 (9-5 Mon Fri)
- 6. The floor on the ground floor is stone but the rest of the staircase and landings are wood. On some of the landings there are rugs on the floor.
- 7. There is natural light and lights on the staircase, as well as additional table lamps on some of the furniture.
- 8. The final staircase onto the roof, is a turret staircase with a rope handrail.
- 9. Wheelchairs can't get into the house as its stairs only
- 10. The tour is limited to 25 people and led by a volunteer.
- 11. There are a few seats (collection) that visitors may sit on, please ask the tour guide on the tour
- 12. There are no toilets in the house
- 13. If you aren't able or don't want to visit the house, we have a digital photo display of inside the house available in the visitor reception.

1. There is a small amount of retail on the reception desk to buy in visitor reception and a second hand books to purchase

### Garden & Ashdown Wood

- 1. The formal garden and parterre around the house are only open when the house is open
- 2. The woods are open every day from dawn to dusk. There are maps available in the carpark. The wood paths are uneven, with a mix of gravel, grass, mud and wood chip surface.
