Introduction

- 1. White Horse Hill is a countryside site with ancient monument (White Horse, Waylands Smithy and Uffington Castle).
- 2. Mobile phone reception can be intermittent depending on the phone network.
- 3. Assistance dogs are welcome and dogs under close control as there can be livestock and horse riders on site.

Arrival & Parking Facilities

- 1. For sat nav users follow SN7 7QJ to the main visitor car park and there are brown signs.
- 2. There are 6 disabled spaces in the main visitor car park on the left hand side as your drive in. The spaces are on hardstanding tarmac and marked.
- 3. There are 6 further disabled spaces on dragon hill road. These are slightly closer to the horse but the car park in wet weather can be rather wet, this car park is a chalk based gravel.

WCs

1. There are no toilets on site.

Countryside around White Horse Hill

- 1. The paths around white horse hill are mostly grass or chalk. They can be steep and uneven in places and aren't suitable for wheelchairs.
- 2. There are benches dotted around the footpaths and a main pic area off the main car park.
- 3. The level pedestrian exit out of the car park to lead up to the hill is in the bottom left corner as you enter the car park. The other exits are steps or sloped road out of the car park.
- 4. On the dragon hill road there are a couple of cattle grids.
- 5. Dragon hill is accessed via the sloped road and steps.
- 6. On the paths there are lots of gates and stiles
