Please follow this map for the wheelchair accessible routes to the house and garden. If you need any further help, please do ask a member of staff. We hope you enjoy your visit.

To help you make the most of your visit

- A portable ramp is available to access the shop
- Four manual wheelchairs are available for hire. These can be pre- booked on 01435 882302 although this is not normally necessary
- An accessible toilet is situated at the top of the site by the ticket office. This is a right hand transfer. Ladies and gents toilets are also situated behind the tearoom
- Assistance and hearing dogs are welcome throughout the site. We do ask for these to be kept on short leads
- A drop off point is available with flat access for anyone unable to negotiate the slope from the ticket office. Please ask a member of staff for directions
- All of the ground floor except for the dining room is accessible to wheelchair users. A virtual tour is available in Elsie's sitting room showing all rooms in the house including the dining room and first floor rooms
