Introduction

Slindon Estate is 3500 acres of Sussex woodland, farmland, downland, and pretty village all divided by paths, hedges, lanes, and tracks. You can explore the estate by 25 miles of public footpaths and bridleways.

Mobile phone reception varies across the site. In an emergency, please make contact on the phone number above as soon as you are able.

Dogs are welcome on the Estate although we ask that people clear up after their dogs and use the dog bins provided. Livestock graze in many areas throughout the year so please be alert. Electric fencing is in use in some areas, so please adhere to signs and put dogs on leads or have them under effective control in and around grazed areas.

Arrival & Parking Facilities

Slindon Estate is located just off the A27, east to west, and the A29, north to south.

There are four small car parks which are free to park in with no marked parking bays.

Duke's Road SU950073

Off Dukes Road, Slindon, between the A27 roundabouts. The car park surface is firm with a top layer of gravel. There is a 2m height barrier at the entrance to this car park What3words: overtime.truffles.struts





Park Lane SU960077Off Park Lane, Slindon, between the A27 roundabout and the A29 crossroads. The car park surface is firm. There is a 2m height barrier at the entrance to this car park. What3words: treetop.jungle.scale



Northwood



Junction SU959098

Follow Top Road north down past Courthill Farm Lane, past Courthill Farm, and park where the road ends. The car park is located where the tarmac ends which can be quite rough, the car park surface is firm. What3words: escape.palm.assembles

Bignor Hill

SU973129

Follow signs to Bignor Roman Villa from the A29 at the bottom of Bury Hill, take the first turning on the left after the

Villa to the top of the hill. The car park surface is firm with a loose layer of gravel. What3words: arise, bubbles, handsets



Public Rights of Way lead into the estate from all directions. Both the South Downs Way and the Monarchs Way pass through the northern end of the estate.



Numerous bridleways cross through Slindon Estate. The South Downs Way and Monarchs Way (only accessible from eastern side) pass through the northern end of the estate. The relatively flat terrain through the woods makes for excellent off-road cycling.

There are no surfaced paths, and some paths can become particularly muddy during winter or wet periods. There are several gates and stiles along various paths. Gates accessing Park Wood are fitted with a RADAR lock.

Trails

A pink waymarked circular route begins from each car park, Duke's Road, Park Lane and Bignor Hill.

There is an additional fourth pink waymarked circular route starting from Northwood Junction.
