## Bird Watching

**Bird watching is really fun.** One way to help you bird watch is by having a bird feeder in your garden. Some birds are not as common as they used to be, so by putting out food you can really help our feathered friends.

To see the most birds you should find a quiet area, like a corner of the garden. If you stay extra quiet, you'll be able to see more birds.

### Some birds you might spot while bird watching

**Robins** sing all the time! They also like to eat seeds, fruit and worms.



**Blue tits** are famous for nesting in unusual places like letterboxes.



Male **blackbirds** are black like their name, but females are often brown.

- Starling
- Woodpigeon

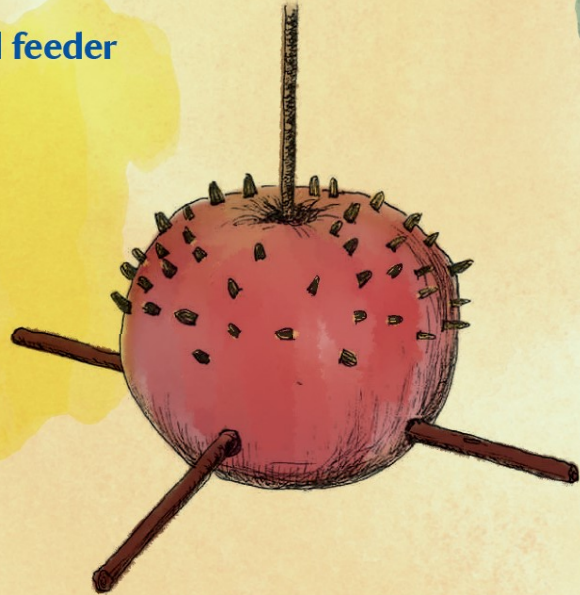

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# Make a bird feeder

## What you need to create your bird feeder

- An apple
- A corer
- Some seeds or nuts
- A few twigs
- A length of string



## How to make your bird feeder

Once you have collected all of your materials, you are ready to make your bird feeder.

1. Carefully remove the apple's core using the corer. You may need to ask an adult to help you with this.
2. Push the seeds into the top half of the apple for the birds to eat.
3. To make a perch for your birds you can push twigs into the bottom of your apple.
4. Use the last, longest twig to tie your string around and thread it through the core of the apple.
5. Once you've finished, tie your apple bird feeder onto a strong tree branch and wait for the birds to come.

If you don't have these materials, you can leave some fruit or nuts on a saucer or just sprinkle bread crumbs on the lawn!

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
