Introduction

Glen House is a two storey mid-terrace cottage with living room and kitchen on the ground floor, bathroom and bedroom on the first floor. Heating and hot water provided by an oil combi boiler with a multi fuel stove in the living room for additional heat

Pre-Arrival

See the main webpage for booking and location details as Holy Island is accessed via a tidal causeway.

Please contact us prior to booking if you have any specific access requirements.

Directions provided with booking.

Bring a torch if arriving in the dark, as there are no streetlights.

Approach

The cottage is located on the right-hand side on the main route to the castle, to the right of the National Trust Shop. The road through the village is tarmac with a mixture of paved and tarmac footpaths.

Arrival & Parking Facilities

There are no designated parking spaces as the road is a public highway. There is room, if available, for one car to park directly outside the cottage.

2 uneven stone steps to front door

Rear access via road to side of National Trust shop. Dark blue door in stone wall on right hand side, door width 800mm.

1 uneven stone step 170mm high onto uneven concrete surface, 3 uneven steps (stone & concrete) onto paving slabs, step heights 170mm, 140mm and 120mm

Wooden garden gate, 7ft tall, 1070mm wide, through to garden area for Glen House (please note that this is shared access to other cottages and National Trust Shop).

Single step into back door onto vinyl flooring, step 130mm high and door 780mm wide

Getting in (and out) of the cottage

Getting around the cottage

Ground floor:

Access to kitchen is via the Sitting Room. The door width is 770mm into small hallway (understairs storage to the right) then up two steps with a height of 150mm each. There is no door leading into the kitchen

Flooring throughout is a mixture of vinyl (kitchen and bathroom) & fitted carpets

Circulation space around the ground floor is reasonable

Stairs to the first floor (14 steps in total) with handrails either side – stair treads are of varying width & height sizes and uneven.

First floor:

Bedroom and bathroom accessed from small landing with reasonable circulation space.

Ground Floor

Sitting Room



- 1 x two seat sofa, measuring 1500mm long by 660 mm deep by 430 mm high
- 1 x armchair, measuring 450 mm high by 550 mm deep
- Bookcase.
- 2 side tables.
- TV Unit (Including TV, DVD player & WiFi).
- 1 central pendant light, 1 standing lamp and 1 table lamp.
- Wood burning stove.

Diner/kitchen



- Height of worktops 910mm.
- Kitchen is a dining kitchen with fitted units.
- Free standing electric cooker and hob.
- Mixer tap.
- 1 Pendant light and 1 spot-strip light
- Washer/Dryer
- Full size fridge freezer
- Round kitchen table 750mm high and 700mm clear knee space underneath. 4 x cushion chairs. Seat height 460mm.
- Oil fired boiler.

Bedroom



- Double bedroom, bed 1830mm wide, length 1960mmfirm mattress height
 640cm beds can be split into twin beds upon request.
- 2 bedside cabinets with table lamps.
- Chest of drawers.
- Wardrobe.
- 1 central pendant light fitting.
- Door width to bedroom 800mm.

Bathroom





- Door into bathroom 640mm wide
- WC, basin and bath with electric shower over.
- The WC is 410mm high
- The bath is 690mm wide, 1680mm long and 550mm high.
- Sink height is 800mm
- Roof window.
- Pendant light and strip light including shaver socket and shelf over basin.

Laundry Room

There is no laundry room in this cottage.

Garden

Small lawned area with shared footpath to rear of property.

Additional Information

- Dogs are welcome at this cottage.
- In the event of a fire, it is the responsibility of the guests to evacuate themselves. Vibrating fire/smoke detectors are available if requested at time of booking. Please contact us if you have any other specific access requirements in this respect.
