

Introduction

- This is an old farm building set in a peaceful valley on land which is part of a hill farm in the hills close to Beddgelert.
- Park and go through the gate and up the field for approximately 500 meters where livestock graze, so visitors should be reasonably fit and active. The field is unlit, so visitors are advised to arrive in daylight and bring a torch with them. Good footwear is advisable.
- The Bothy can accommodate 8 people in bunks and sleeping platform.
- There is lighting provided by solar panels, but torches are a must.
- Parking is available at the roadside.

Path to Bothy

The Bothy is arranged as follows

Main Room:

 Consists of a large open barn space with 4 Bunks. There is also a kitchen unit containing a sink with running cold water. The cupboard contains all the cleaning, and first aid supplies you may need while staying at the Bothy.

Secondary Room:

The secondary room contains two sleeping platforms

Toilet Facilities:

There is a flushing toilet behind the Bothy

Pre-Arrival

- See the main webpage for booking and location details.
- Please contact us prior to booking if you have any specific access requirements.
- Directions provided with booking
- Bringing a torch is a must if arriving in the dark as the Bothy is set in a field and there are no streetlights where the car is parked.

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Approach

• The roadway to the Bothy is narrow with few pacing place so great care must be taken. There is room for at least one care in the gravelled pull in at the field gate but please make sure you do not block the gate. From the gate proceed up the path to an Oak tree blocks your way then turn almost in the direction you have walked, and the Bothy is there, it has stone walls and a rusty tin roof with one solar panel.

Arrival & Parking Facilities

There is parking space for one car directly as described above.

Getting in (and out) of the Bothy

- From the field there is a small step of 2cm then a step of 8cm up in to the main room where the bunks are positioned, there is also a step of 10cm up to the kitchen area.
- The front door has a clear opening width of 79cm and height of 159cm.

Kitchen Area

- Height of worktop which hold the sink and drainer is 94cm.
- A long bench is against the wall with a seat height of 40cm.
- There is a wooden box like structure which holds the solar panel electrics which should be locked.

Second Bedroom

- The entrance door is 76cm wide and 153cm in height.
- There is a step up into the room which is 5cm high.
- The sleeping platforms of which there is two are both 40cm to top of platform and 70cm in width.

Toilet

- At the rear of the Bothy is a toilet which also contains a wash hand basin.
- The toilet seat is 42cm from the floor
- The sink is 75cm from floor level
- There is a step up into the toilet from the grassed area of 8cm
