

Things to see and do



House

The Georgian house, set within a 300 acre deer park, was a family home for seven generations, uniting the Booths of Warrington and the Greys of Stamford. The house showcases fascinating objects from the extensive collection, displayed in the familiar setting of a traditional country house.



Gardens

There are 30 acres of gardens featuring both historical and modern planting. Historical features include an Elizabethan mount, an eighteenth-century orangery and a bark house. You enter through the maturing winter garden, one of the largest in Britain. Here, thousands of snowdrops, iris, daffodils, tulips and bluebells bloom from January through to May. Continue to the sweeping lawn area beyond and summer colour can be found in the herbaceous borders and large rose garden. September is great for those who like a quieter but no less colourful visit, with the saloon border and kitchen garden looking their best. Autumn sees the changing colours of the Acers, the smell of burnt toffee from the Katsura trees and the rose garden continuing to bloom until the first frost.



Deer Park

As well as the herd of 150 fallow deer, the park offers great circular walks amongst the tree-lined avenues. It's home to some of the best examples of ancient and veteran trees in the country which in turn support a host of unique insect life. For this reason, the park is a Site of Special Scientific Interest. Bird watchers can enjoy the sight of herons, woodpeckers and, if you're lucky, kingfishers.



Mill

Over 400 years old, the Mill is the oldest building within Dunham's park walls. The Mill is open by guided tour only. Please ask when booking your group for more information.

On the day

On arrival at the entrance gates, please follow the one way system to the car park kiosk for check in and payment with our car park team who will signpost you to the coach parking bays.

The coach can remain here for the duration of your visit. The driver will not be charged an admission fee.

Please let your group board the coach at the parking bay at the end of your visit.

When to visit

Dunham Massey is a very busy property so we do limit the number of groups we can accept on any given day. If we have more than one group booking, we may ask you to stagger your arrival time. We cannot take group bookings on Sundays, Bank Holidays and event weekends due to already high visitor demand.

In severe weather conditions, we may have to close the property. In this event your group will be contacted on the morning of your visit.
