Introduction

- White Mill is an 18th Century corn mill with original wooden machinery and was built on a Domesday Book site in a peaceful riverside setting.
- There is generally poor mobile phone reception at the Mill.
- Assistant dogs are welcome throughout the property. Please ensure they are wearing their identity harnesses.
- Path and floor surfaces around the site are gravel, chippings, flagstones, tarmac and grass.
- Light levels in the Mill can vary.

Arrival & Parking Facilities

- There are brown signs from the B3082 between Wimborne Minster and Blandford Forum, and then as you approach the mill.
- There is 1 designated space for disabled people adjacent to the Mill. Further disabled visitors can be dropped at the Mill and park in the main car park.
- The main car park is suitable for between 20-30 cars and is situated approx. 100m from the mill across two public roads. The car park consists of uneven/rutted earth and mud with no marked parking spaces.

WCs

- There are no toilets available on site.

Visitor Reception

- All visitors are welcomed by the team from a hatch in the main Mill building on the gravel/chippings path, 3m from the entrance gate to the site.

Mill

- White Mill is approximately 100m from the car park.
- Floor surface in the Mill consists of flag stones and wood.
- The floors in the Mill are uneven in places due to the historic nature of the building.
- Access to the building is through door (1m wide) via 2 steps (approx. 250mm each) to ascend and 2 steps (approx. 250mm each) to descend. Portable ramp (1800mm) is available for access to view Mill.
- Alternative entrance to Mill for viewing (door 800mm).
- Viewing of Mill available via Reception door and Back door. Please ask at Reception for access.
- First floor is accessed via steep wooden.
- Handrails available throughout visitor route.
- Access is via guided tour only.

Garden

- The garden is bordered by the River Stour, with no fixed barrier marking its edge.
- There are picnic tables located in the garden adjacent to the Mill. One of these is suitable for a wheelchair.
- The garden is uneven in places.
- Do the steps have handrails?
