Blossom hotspots

1. Finchale Road

Cherry street trees will be blossoming from April.

2. Durham Road

Cherry street trees will be blossoming from April.

3. Aykley Heads Nature Reserve

Visit Aykley Heads Nature Reserve from April to see blossoming trees, including near to County Hall.

4. Newton Hall

Cherry street trees can be found in and around Newton Hall, blossoming from April.

5. Crook Hall Gardens

Visit Crook Hall Gardens from late April - May to experience the apple blossom sprinkled amongst a carpet of spring flowers.

6. Wharton Park

A variety of trees can be found blossoming at Wharton Park from April onwards.

7. Flass Vale Local Nature Reserve

Visit Flass Vale Local Nature Reserve from April to see blossoming trees.

8. Durham Cathedral

Hawthorn and cherry trees are found blossoming around Palace Green and near The College from April. Look out for the double flowers on the autumn cherries in the College Garth later in the autumn season.

9. Gilesgate

Cherry blossom trees can be seen on Gilesgate village green from April.

Please check venue websites for opening times and admission charges.

10. College of St Hild and St Bede (Pelaw Wood)

Blossom can be found within the grounds of the college and into the woods from April.

11. The Count's House

A beautiful cherry tree will be blossoming from April at the Count's House.

12. Old Durham Gardens

Visit Old Durham Gardens from April to see the fruit trees in blossom.

13. Durham University

Blossom is scattered throughout Durham University, including near the Bill Bryson Library. Visit from late March/April to see cherry and tulip trees in bloom.

14. Botanic Garden

Beautiful blossoms can be enjoyed throughout the University's Botanic Garden (entry charge applies). Visit to enjoy their cherry blossom walk or to experience the year-round blossoming flowers and plants. Look out for blossom walks and picnics later in spring.

15. Oriental Museum

Visit the Oriental Museum throughout April, to find cherry trees blossoming outside.

16. Low Burnhall woods

Visit Low Burnhall to see seasonal Japanese and wild cherry blossom along with the scent and beauty of other native tree and wildflower blooms.

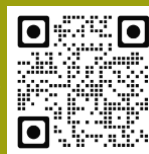

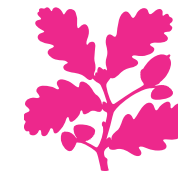
