Exploring the house

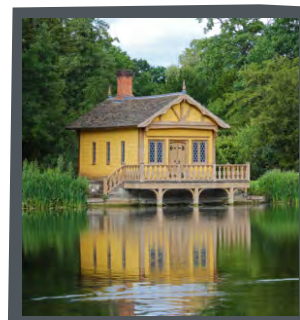
The house is open every day*, sometimes for guided visits and 'free-flow' at others.

You can borrow mobility aids from the Hub, including wheelchairs, mobility scooters, and sensory packs.

The full Access Guide can be picked up at the Welcome Hub or viewed online. There are areas of uneven cobbles, gravel and some places can be muddy after rain. There are garden and park maps that show access routes.

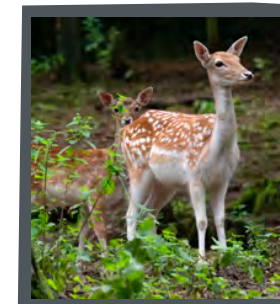


Enjoy the adventure playground and miniature train or have fun in the Play Caf  . Why not pick up an activity trail or race to the centre of the maze?

Visiting with your dog?

Dogs must be kept on short leads everywhere. This is to keep everyone safe and protect Belton's wildlife.

Dogs are welcome in the gardens, parkland and courtyard areas including the stables caf  , gift shop and bookshop.

Assistance dogs only are allowed in play areas, the house and conservatory.

Please pick up after your pooch and use the dog or general waste bins provided.
