# This is Clumber Park

# Arrival

From Lime Tree Avenue and main crossroads, you will come down a drive to the welcome point, where staff will give you information for your day out at Clumber Park.

If you need tickets, you can buy them here or scan your membership card.



# Car park

You will arrive in the car park. You can find accessible parking close to the main visitor facilities.

The Cow Pastures car park is in the parkland on grass and can be muddy. It is around a 5-10-minute walk to the main visitor facilities.



# Route to main facilities

On the route to the main facilities, you'll pass the Information Point and second-hand bookshop.

 You can collect a map and buy National Trust membership here. Sensory bags are available to borrow.

 Inside you will meet our visitor welcome team who wear black t-shirts and fleeces, and a National Trust name badge.



 This can be a busy space.

# Route to main facilities

For the main facilities, walk through the archway adjacent to the accessible car park. This is the Lincoln Stables.

In this area you'll find an ice cream parlour and display rooms to explore.

Head through the next archway and bare right which leads to more visitor facilities.

 Look out for signage arrows to help with directions.



# Toilets and baby change

The nearest toilets on arrival are in the Turning Yard, along with the main visitor facilities

Here you'll find accessible toilets, ladies and gents' toilets, a baby change with unisex toilet and a Changing Places toilet.



The hand driers in the toilets make a loud sound.



# Where you might eat



There is an indoor café in the Turning Yard. You might see cakes and drinks here.



This can be a busy space with lots of smells.



Our dog friendly café, Central Bark is located between the walled kitchen garden and the cricket ground. It's a 10-minute walk from the main facilities.



# Gift Shop

There is an indoor gift shop in the main visitor facilities.



You might see toys, blankets and food to buy.



This can be a noisy and busy area.



# Play area (Woodland Play Park)



This is the play area with wooden play equipment; it is within the Main Visitor Facilities. You will find things to explore, touch and play with.



There are some benches.



This place can get noisy. Other visitors may be running, jumping or shouting as they play.
