This map illustrates the Wey Navigation, a canalized section of the River Wey in Surrey. The river flows from Chertsey in the north to Godalming in the south. Key features include:

- Locks:** Thames Lock, Town Lock, Coxes Lock, New Haw Lock, Parvis Lock, Pyrford Lock, Walsham Gates, Newark Lock, Cartbridge Lock, Worsfold Gates, Triggs Lock, Bowers Lock, Stoke Lock, Millmead Lock, St Catherine's Lock, Unstead Lock, and Catteshall Lock.
- Footbridges:** Blackboys, Woodham, Murray's, Dodds, Tanyard, High, Send Church, Broad Oak, and Broadford.
- Towpaths:** Yellow lines indicate the towpaths along the river.
- Local Landmarks:** Addlestone, Byfleet, West Byfleet, Ripley, Send, Guildford, Shalford, and Godalming.
- Infrastructure:** Roads (A317, A245, A25, A3, A281, A258, A3100), railways (M25, M3, Woking, Clandon House, Wey and Arun Canal), and various buildings like the Grist Mill, Navigation Workshops, and Old Gunpowder Store.
- Navigation Limits:** The map shows the limit of navigation at Godalming Town Bridge.

The map also includes a key for symbols (locks, footbridges, towpaths, etc.), a scale bar (0-3 km / 0-2 miles), and a north arrow.
