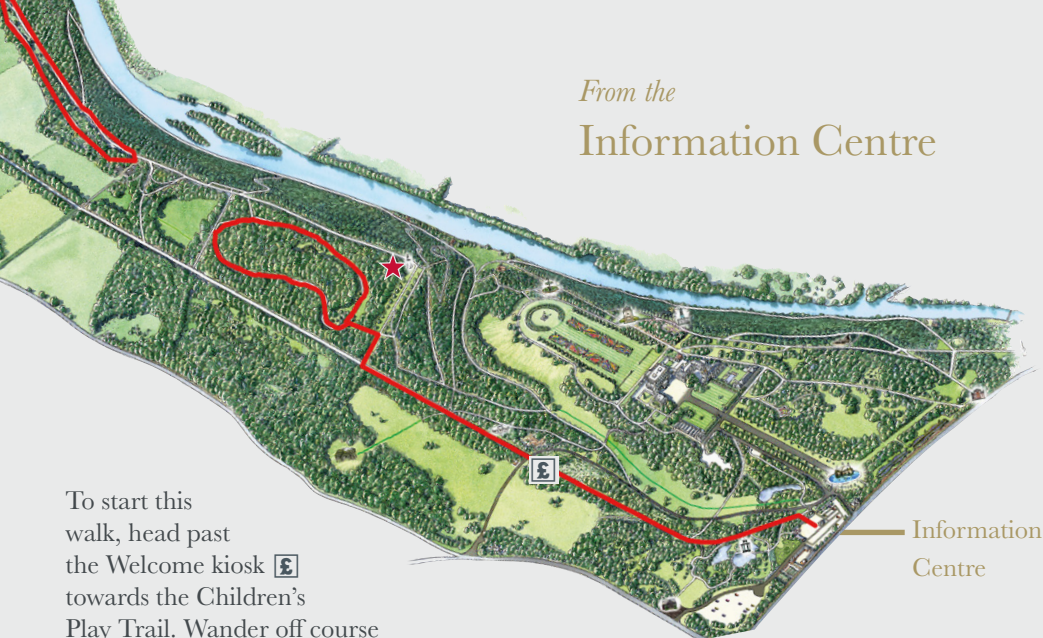
Cliveden's Bluebells




A self-led guide

Take a stroll around the estate and view the bluebell bounty at its best. You can spot woodland gems such as lesser celandines and tiny dog violets scattered among broad-leaved trees which date from the late 19th or 20th centuries.

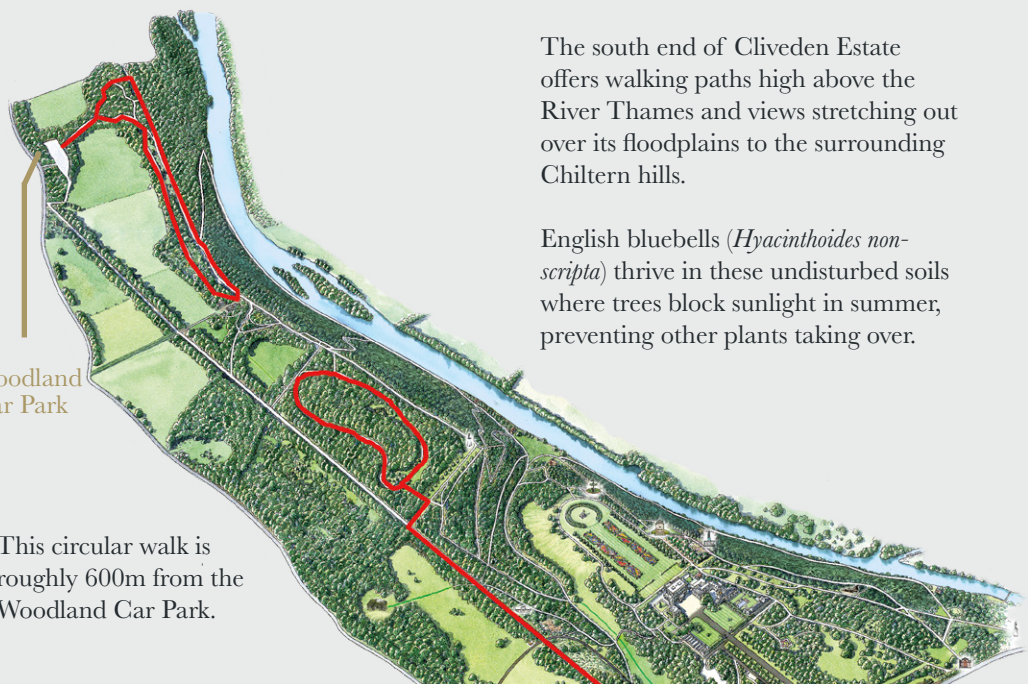

To start this walk, head past the Welcome kiosk  towards the Children's Play Trail. Wander off course and pause for breath at the view point (★). This circular walk is roughly 1.5 miles.

From the Woodland Car Park



The south end of Cliveden Estate offers walking paths high above the River Thames and views stretching out over its floodplains to the surrounding Chiltern hills.

English bluebells (*Hyacinthoides non-scripta*) thrive in these undisturbed soils where trees block sunlight in summer, preventing other plants taking over.
