Introduction

This countryside property is located on the top of a sandstone ridge, the highest point in the South Downs. Footpaths link to nearby Sussex Border Path, Greensand Way and the Serpent trail. The main circular path made up of naturally occurring sandstone on the top of Black Down and is accessible from the main car park (SU920308). The main footpath is relatively flat with minor slopes and loose stone underfoot. Not suitable for wheel chair users however, there is a view point with bench accessible through a radar gate at the lower car park, 100 meters down Tennyson's lane (SU923306). All dogs are welcome, including Assistance Dogs. Livestock do graze in some areas so please be alert to this and keep dogs under close control.

NB - Mobile phone reception is generally good but can be affected in some parts of Black Down dependant on your network. In an emergency, please make contact on the phone number above as soon as you are able.

Arrival & Parking Facilities

The main car park (SU920308) entrance is accessible off of Tennyson's Lane, Haslemere. The tracks leading to car parks can sometimes suffer from weather and user damage, take caution when on approach. There is a second over fill car park 100 meters along Tennyson's Lane, Lower car park (SU923306). There is ample car space and there is currently no charge for parking.

There are no refreshment or toilet facilities available on site. Haslemere town centre has shops and restaurants under 3 miles from the main car park. A public toilet is situated in Waitrose car park.

Trails

There is a map available to show the routes of the site on the noticeboard near the car park. Way marker posts around the park indicate the direction of the routes.
