

## Cobham Wood & Mausoleum

### Introduction

1. Cobham Mausoleum, designed by the 18th-century architect James Wyatt, is set in historic woodland, once part of the Cobham estate.
2. Limited mobile reception.
3. Dogs on leads in the mausoleum welcome
4. The mausoleum is accessed by a series of 16 stone steps to the Crypt and 10 to the Chapel .

### Arrival & Parking Facilities

1. Dropping off outside South Lodge is possible.
2. Mausoleum is located up a 1 mile track – mostly flat with an incline near the approach.

### WCs

1. No toilets available.

### Mausoleum

1. The mausoleum is a mile walk from South Lodge Barn. Parking is available from Shorne Park which is similar distance with more challenging terrain.
2. The paths are solid but not fully surfaced with pit holes.
3. There are benches along the path and approx. 20 metres from the mausoleum entrance.
4. The Mausoleum chapel is accessed via 10 steps.
5. The Mausoleum crypt is accessed via going down 16 steps.

## Woodland

1. The woodland is normally grazed by highland cattle.
2. The walks are not currently all waymarked.
3. The most simple route to the mausoleum is from South Lodge.
4. There is a gentle incline at the approach to the mausoleum.
5. There are walks that cross section the woods eg to Shorne Country Park.
6. There are seats at regular intervals during the walk – approx. every 500 metres.
