Introduction

1. Wellington Monument is in a remote location situated on the Blackdown Hills, approx. 5 miles from Wellington town centre.
2. There is no visitor reception or publicly accessible buildings.
3. There is one main way-marked route, of varying gradient and terrain.
4. All dogs are welcome, including Assistance Dogs.

NB - Mobile phone reception is not very good across the site. In an emergency, please make contact on the phone number above as soon as you are able.

Arrival & Parking Facilities

There is one small car park at Wellington Monument. The car park surface is firm with a top layer of loose gravel. There are no marked bays or designated blue badge spaces.



There is a payment machine at the car park. The cost to park is £1 for 2 hours / £3 all day, or free for National Trust members.

Facilities

There are no facilities at the property.

Trails

There is one waymarked route at Wellington Monument, which is approx. one mile long. The first section follows the avenue from the car park to the monument, which is flat and accessible, and approx. 600m in length. There are regular rest stops along the avenue (about every 200m). The route has mixed terrain and some tree routes.



The terrain when continuing past the monument becomes uneven and includes a steep slope and climb, it can become muddy and boggy during periods of wet weather.
