

The Granary shop is easily accessible with no steps at the entrance. You can order tea, coffee and cake from here as well as browse what's for sale. Upstairs there is a seating area but this is up a very steep set of stairs. Outside in the courtyard, just outside the Granary are benches you're welcome to use.

There is a ramp up through the gatehouse to access the manor house, there is also the option to climb up into the building via a steep staircase.

There is a small step up into the Second hand bookshop and the building itself is very small with little room to manoeuvre.

A hard pathway then runs from Visitor Reception to the main courtyard for around 300 yards.

There are no hard pathways in the orchard meaning accessibility is limited, especially during wet weather.

There is a small step up into the manor house with a portable ramp available. Inside the house there is a large step down, leading to the kitchen and lounge. The only access to the first floor is via a set of stairs.

The woodshed, next to the house is easily accessible and shows a film on the history of Brockhampton
