- Look out for birds such as curlews and pied flycatchers returning

Summer

- Listen to the red deer bellowing on the Eastern Moors



Winter

- Watch colourful sunsets through the bare trees
- On fine days, watch out for woodpeckers swooping between the trees

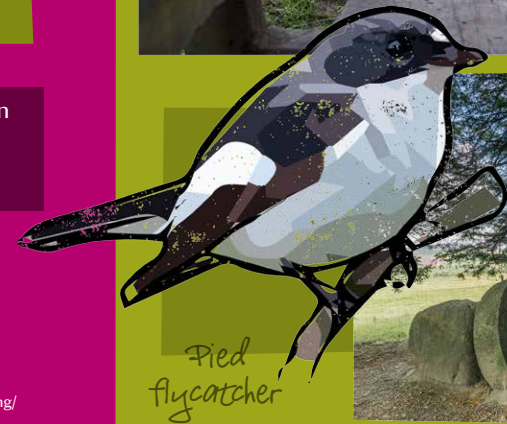

Make the most of your day



- Follow the arrows on our pink, orange or blue waymarked walks (see map)
- Find seasonal food, walks guides, gifts and more in the shop and café
- Explore the orienteering trail (£1.50 from the shop)
- Ride your bike along the Duke's Drive route
- Explore the kitchen garden behind the café
- Find Duke's Seat and admire the spectacular view

Explore a little further

Here are five great places you might like to explore on your visit to Longshaw (see the numbers on the map).

1 Discover the woods that blanket the old Bolehill quarries and look out for moss-covered millstones.



2 Take a picnic and paddle in Burbage Brook or explore rocky tors of Lawrence Field.



3 Look out for woodland birds amongst the tumbled rocks and twisted oak trees of Padley Gorge and Yarncliffe Wood.



4 Watch the Northern Hairy Wood Ants in spring and summer, or follow the Hairy Wood Ant Trail (Trail available from shop, £1).

5 Go wild in the woods! Run, skip, climb, jump and balance your way around the family Boggart Trail.
