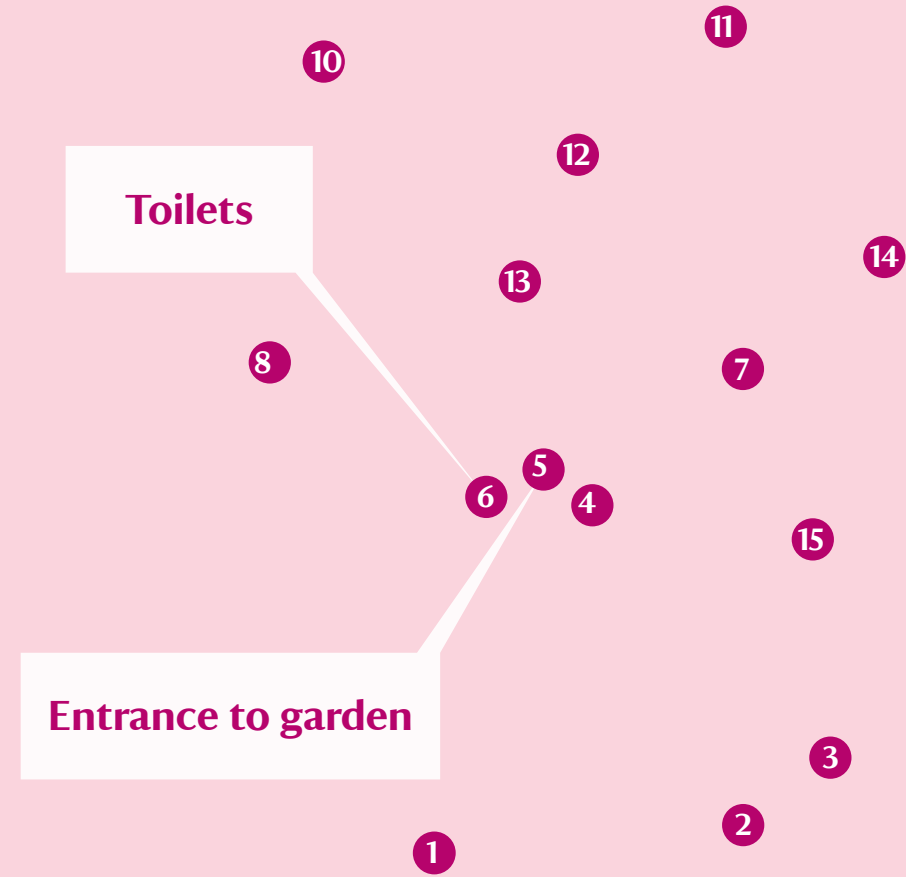

Access guide

An access guide with information for wheelchair users and visitors with mobility difficulties is available. Access to the house is across the front courtyard and through the garden entrance. There is a ramp on the right hand side. The stairs in the house are quite steep and narrow.

We have a photo book for visitors who aren't able to access the first floor. The toilets near to the accessible car park have adapted facilities.
