- Please remember to maintain social distancing at all times.
- In line with government guidance, you're required to wear a face covering inside unless exempt. Please bring one with you.
- The wider estate, pleasure grounds, Wilderness play, Victorian Flower Garden, Walled Kitchen Garden and toilets are open between 10am-3.30pm.
- The Old Kitchen tea-room is open for takeaway hot & cold drinks and snacks between 10.30am-3.30pm. One-way system in place.
- Toilets are cleaned twice a day so may be closed temporarily for short periods.
- The car park closes at 4pm. Please ensure you are back to collect your car by this time so our staff can close the car park.
- Please keep dogs on leads in the pleasure grounds and Victorian Flower Garden. Please pick up after your dog and use the dog waste bins available (as shown on the map).
- Bicycles are not allowed in the pleasure grounds or Victorian Flower Garden.
- If you're bringing a picnic, please make sure you take all your waste home with you.

Welcome to Arlington Court. We're pleased to be able to share this special place with you once again, but things are different, so do bear with us. Please remember to maintain social distancing at all times and read the signage around the grounds for further instruction.

Dog owners – **please keep dogs on leads in the pleasure grounds and Victorian Flower Garden.** Please use dog waste bins provided.

The areas that are open to visitors are highlighted below. Everything else remains closed.

- Key:
- 1** Car park – pre-booked tickets only
 - 2** Visitor reception
 - 3** Toilets – please note this may be unavailable at times when cleaning is taking place
 - 4** Victorian Flower Garden & Walled Kitchen Garden – one-way route, please follow instructions on the signage
 - 5** The Old Kitchen tea-room – takeaway only. Please note we can only accept card payment.
 - 6** Bird hide – only 2 people or 1 family allowed inside at a time
 - 7** Wilderness natural play
 -  Dog waste bins
 -  Pleasure grounds (blue line) – please note this is part of the garden
 -  Lake walk (red line) – not suitable for wheelchairs or mobility scooters. Approximately 2 miles long and takes around an hour. Please note this walk is only signposted one way but is a circular route.
- Please take care near areas of open water including the Lake, Wilderness and garden ponds.
