

Terms and Conditions of Hanbury Hall and Gardens 2016 Photographic Competition

1. The competition is open to all residents of the UK as per the age categories, except for employees of the National Trust. Entries from the age categories Under 10 and 10 to 16 must have the permission of a parent or guardian.
2. All information detailing how to enter this competition forms part of the terms and conditions. It is a condition of entry that the terms and conditions are adhered to. Submission of an entry will be taken to mean acceptance of the terms and conditions and, in respect of entries in the two younger categories, that appropriate consent is given.
3. A maximum of three entries per person may be submitted into the appropriate age category, with age determined as it will be on the closing date of Friday, 30 September 2016.
4. Images must have been taken at Hanbury Hall and Gardens between Tuesday, 1 March and Friday, 30 September 2016.
5. Entries shall only be accepted if accompanied by a completed competition entry form; available from the Hanbury Hall webpage. Entries to be submitted by email to **hanburyhall@nationaltrust.org.uk**.
6. Entrants must be able to provide a digital file of their image of no less than 6 megapixels.
7. Entries must be received by midnight on the closing date of **Friday, 30 September 2016**.
8. Entries may be rejected if:
 - a. They contain defamatory, malicious, indecent or other inappropriate content
 - b. Include the names, likenesses, images or similar of any individual without their permission
 - c. Represent a danger to health and safety
 - d. Disparage the promoter or any other person or part affiliated with the promotion
9. It is the responsibility of each entrant to ensure that any images they submit have been taken with the consent of anyone who is identifiable in that image or with the consent of their parent/guardian if the image is of someone under the age of 16 years, and that they have been advised of the purpose of the submission and that their photograph may be published by the National Trust.
10. Entrants must ensure that they submit photographs which are their own work, that they own the copyright for them and that they do not infringe the copyright or other rights of any third party or any laws.
11. Entrants will retain copyright and moral rights of any images submitted however, by entering, all entrants:
 - a. Grant the National Trust non-exclusive rights to use the images to promote the competition the images were submitted to, and for similar future competitions within a five year period of the winners being announced for the competition that the images concerned were submitted to
 - b. Agree that the use referred to in clause 11a above may include publishing, displaying or otherwise reproducing the images, provided such use is for the purpose of promoting the competition or similar future competitions only
 - c. Agree that the National Trust contact them, using the contact details provided, to discuss potential use of the images beyond promotion of the competition. Such discussion and negotiation would be independent from the competition and would not affect entrants chances of winning

12. The overall winning entry from each category will be chosen by a panel of independent judges from all legible photographs submitted.
13. The overall winner for each category will be contacted via email by **Tuesday, 1 November 2016** and will win the following Panasonic Camera donated by Panasonic:
 - **Under 10:** Panasonic Lumix FT5 digital camera
 - **10-16:** Panasonic Lumix TZ70 digital camera
 - **17 +:** Panasonic Lumix FZ200 digital cameraThe prize is non-transferable and there is no cash alternative. The prize can only be sent to a UK postal address.
14. Events may occur that render the competition itself or awarding of the prizes impossible due to reasons beyond the control of the National Trust and accordingly the National Trust may, at its absolute discretion, vary or amend the promotion and the entrant agrees that no liability shall attach to the promotor as a result thereof.
15. English law applies and the exclusive jurisdiction of the English Courts shall prevail.
