House: open by timed entry tickets only, bookable online in advance with limited places available on the day. Some rooms and areas may close at short notice (please check before visiting).

***Christmas Experience: Wednesday through to Sunday, house open to 6 and garden (with light displays) to 7.00. Everything closed 16 January and 25 December. ** Closes at 6 in main season (1 March to 28 October).**

Kingston Lacy

Our house is open to all visitors daily; please see our website for public opening times and information on how to book your timed tickets. Please note that house entry is by timed ticket only and the group price list below is for 2019.

Step inside the home of one of the most powerful families of Dorset and discover the history of Kingston Lacy and the flamboyant Bankes family. See one of the finest private collections of paintings in Britain with works by Rubens Van Dyck, Tintoretto, Titian and Brueghel. Also, step back thousands of years and discover the largest private gentleman's collection of genuine Egyptian relics in the UK.

Go for a wander around our gardens and parklands at Kingston Lacy and look out for the ancient Egyptian obelisk, transported all the way to Dorset with the help of the Duke of Wellington, marvel at the Japanese Garden or explore the restored Victorian kitchen garden.

Enjoy the shelter of the woodland walks, walk amongst the oldest known herd of Ruby Red Devon cattle in the world and let the kids discover the play areas.

House Tours (March to October)

All house tours last approx. 60 mins and cost £2.50 a head (recommended for those over 12 years of age).

Due to the small size of many of the rooms these tours are only available before the house opens to the public with the first tour beginning at 10.00 am and last tour beginning at 10.40 am. Up to 15 people per tour and subject to availability.

House Tour options:

Tour One – An introduction to the Bankes family and their incredible home

Tour Two – An exploration of an incredible artwork collection and the stories it has to tell

Tour Three – A closer look at the furnishings and artefacts collected by the Bankes family

Tour Four – A behind the scenes look at our conservation work



Garden Tour Options (March to October)

All garden tours last approx. 60 mins and cost £2.50 a head. Up to 20 people per tour and subject to availability.

Tour One – Kingston Lacy formal gardens; enjoy this overview of the gardens and countryside with treasures, hidden corners and seasonal plants weaved into the Bankes family story.

Tour Two – Escape to the orient and explore the Japanese garden; a visit to this area of the garden tells the story of our conservation work, also step into the tea garden to experience its spiritual nature.

Take time out for a bite to eat

The Stables Café at Kingston Lacy is open during property opening hours. Enjoy hot and cold drinks, wholesome soups, light bites, cream teas, fresh cakes, sandwiches and cooked lunches (hot food is served 12.00 pm – 2.30 pm). We strongly recommend that groups book lunch or refreshments in advance (the Coach House can be reserved for groups if available). If you opt for a free-flow lunch or afternoon tea and choose not to book, please be advised that the café can be extremely busy and you may have to queue.

If you fancy a picnic, you are very welcome to collect sandwiches or a take away cream tea from our café, which can also be booked in advance. Alternatively, please bring your own and enjoy relaxing on the south lawn.

Please indicate on the booking form if you would like to book refreshments or food.

Accessibility

There is a volunteer driven 'leg saver' transfer service from the car park to the house, shop, restaurant and sundial in the garden. We have three wheelchairs and three self-drive mobility scooters available for loan. There is an accessible toilet in the laundry courtyard. The gardens and parkland feature gravel paths. There is level access to the ground floor of the house only, which includes two rooms and a virtual tour. Electric wheelchairs, mobility buggies and pushchairs are not admitted to the house for conservation reasons. Garden tours are fully accessible for wheelchair and mobility scooter users. If you would like to borrow these, it is best to book in advance with Visitor Reception.

A sample itinerary

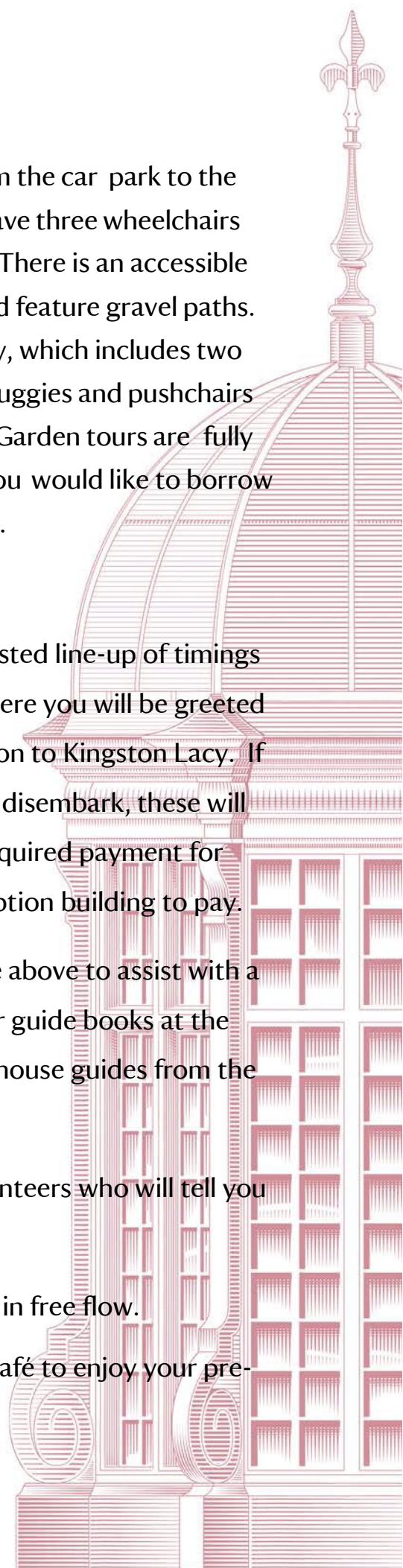
As a rough guide for planning your day, here is our suggested line-up of timings and activities. On arrival, please remain on the coach, where you will be greeted by our visitor welcome team and given a short introduction to Kingston Lacy. If members can have their membership cards ready as they disembark, these will be dealt with speedily. The person responsible for any required payment for entry can then accompany our team member to the reception building to pay.

10.00 am – arrive at Kingston Lacy car park and see note above to assist with a quick transition through reception. You can buy souvenir guide books at the shop and collect a house guide or foreign translations of house guides from the house entrance.

10.30 am – house tour, led by one of our passionate volunteers who will tell you some of our fascinating stories.

11.30 am – take some time to enjoy the rest of the house in free flow.

12.30 pm - refreshments and lunch, head to our stables café to enjoy your pre-booked lunch or pick up a picnic and relax on the lawns.



1.30 pm – garden tour, led by our garden guide volunteers who will bring these beautiful outdoor spaces to life for your group.

2.30 pm - explore the wider gardens and parkland, there are acres to enjoy.

3.00 pm - afternoon tea, take time to pop into our café and enjoy tea and cake. and browse the plants and souvenirs in our shop, in the main courtyard.

4.00 pm – depart, head back to the visitor car park to board your coach.

To make a booking for your Group Visit

Please follow these simple steps:

- You have now received your group information guide and booking form (Should you need further copies please download them from our website).
- Next, please complete the form, detailing all of your requirements and return by email.
- We will confirm receipt of your booking request and will then get in touch to confirm your booking or to notify you if any of your requests cannot be met due to availability.
- Please be aware that we have space for a maximum of two coaches in our car park at any one time and require a minimum of **one month's notice for your booking**. We know that it might be difficult for you to confirm final group numbers in advance of your visit. We therefore ask that you contact us **two weeks prior to your booking**, to confirm your final numbers including **the number of National Trust members**. This enables us to welcome you and reduces the time you may have to spend waiting in reception.
- **Please note that there is a minimum charge for 15 people per Group Booking.**
- **We no longer take Group Bookings over the school holidays, school half terms, bank holidays and Easter weekend.**
