A guide to visiting Morden Hall Park during the COVID-19 pandemic

We would be very grateful if you would take a moment to read the information below to help ensure that all our visitors have the best possible experience whilst they are here.

- Please follow the latest government COVID-19 guidelines at all times
- Please take your rubbish home with you. We already spend over £40,000 a year throwing away other people's rubbish, anything not put into a bin can cause damage to habitats or wildlife. If you need additional bin bags please ask a member of staff in the Stable yard office.
- Please do not erect gazebos in the Rose Garden and the areas around the Stable Yard, or anywhere in the park on windy days – this will help us minimise the risk of them causing any injuries or damage.
- We ask that you don't have large gatherings or play sports in the Rose Garden or areas around the Stable yard, as these areas can become crowded (you are welcome to use the lawns near the White Bridge to play sports but please respect other visitors).
- Help us keep the trees looking beautiful by avoiding tying or pinning anything to them, this includes pompoms, bunting and balloons, as you will be asked to take these down.
- Due to the large number of visitors every year we ask everyone to avoid climbing trees or picking flowers as this causes long term damage to the biodiversity of the park.
- Please ensure dogs are kept on leads in the Rose Garden and around buildings.
- Due to the risk of fire we don't allow BBQs anywhere in the park.
- For your own safety we don't encourage entering the river as there is the potential of injury (no swim zones are strictly in place for the Mill Pond, weir and outside the workshops).
- We reserve the right to ask you to move, or close the park, at short notice should we believe that there is an imminent health and safety, COVID-19 or conservation related concern.

We are a currently a very small team of staff and volunteers looking after this special space, so please help us to keep the park open for visitors by leaving the park clean and tidy and adhering to the latest government COVID-19 guidelines.
