CONDITIONS OF USAGE

All persons using the River Wey and Godalming Navigations are subject to the provisions of the National Trust Acts 1907-1971, the Acts of Parliament of 1670 and 1760, "The Byelaws" and the following additional regulations. Where there is a conflict between the Conditions and the Byelaws, the Byelaws will prevail.

- 1 All power craft navigating or moored on the Navigations shall be appropriately insured, licensed and have a current Boat Safety Certificate.
- 2 All craft are to be registered and must display a current navigation licence. In the interests of safety or convenience owners are required to moor or move their craft and otherwise use the Navigations' installations according to such instructions as are given from time to time by the Navigation staff.
- 3 Licences are issued at the discretion of the National Trust and may be withdrawn without reimbursement following the infringement of regulations or non-payment of fees.
- 4 **Craft should not moor on bends or within 50 metres of a lock.
No craft to be left unattended overnight except at bona fide mooring sites.
Locks may not be operated nor may craft navigate on any day between the periods half an hour after sunset and half an hour before sunrise, or at any time during flood conditions.**
Any exceptions by previous arrangement only with Navigation staff.
- 5 In general you can moor anywhere suitable along the 20 miles of towpath for a period of 24 hours at any one site.
- 6 The National Trust reserves the right to move any craft and its moorings. When taking this action the National Trust is to be considered as an appointed agent of the craft owner.
- 7 **RULE OF THE ROAD** Keep to the right and make allowances for vessels of deeper draught and restricted manoeuvrability. Know the basic rules of the road for waterways.
- 8 **THE MAXIMUM SPEED IS 8 km/hour** (a brisk walking pace) Craft must reduce speed if causing a wash, damage or danger to banks, moored craft, or other persons or property.
- 9 All powered craft are to be marked with a registered means of identification, e.g. name, number or initials of 75mm (3") height minimum on each side of the bow and on the stern in a contrasting colour to the background. Tenders are to be marked on the stern the same as the parent craft. Traditional narrow boats and rowboats should bear a similar means of identification.
- 10 **OPERATING LOCKS**
 - Ensure that craft are adequately roped fore and aft with engines switched off
 - A correct Navigation approved windlass should be used to operate the sluice gear
 - Both gates should be open for entry and exit
 - for user safety portable craft which can be easily lifted in/out of water should portage around locks
- 11 Motorised inflatables, motorised semi-rigid inflatables, water bikes, jet skis or similar are not permitted on the Navigations.
- 12 Unauthorised interference or operation of any of the water level regulating gates, sluices or locks renders the offender liable to prosecution.
- 13 Only the boat crew of a craft licensed to navigate may operate locks on the Navigations (Thames Lock only to be operated by National Trust staff).
- 14 No sanitary or other effluent or litter of any description is to be discharged into the Navigations or on National Trust property.
- 15 No craft may be used on the Navigations for residential purposes, commercial or private gain without special licence.
- 16 Use of metal detectors or digging on National Trust property, the Navigation beds, banks and towpaths is prohibited.
- 17 Persons bringing craft onto the Navigations do so at their own risk. The National Trust, its employees and servants, cannot be held responsible for loss damage liability or expense caused by negligent use by boat users.
- 18 The National Trust does not accept custody of nor any other responsibility whatsoever for the safety or security of such goods or craft whilst on the Trust's property. The National Trust does not accept any liability for loss or damage to goods or craft attributable to any cause except insofar as such loss or damage is proved to be due to negligence on the part of the Trust or its staff.
