Mini Makers' Paper Daffodil Craft

This week we're getting crafty making a simple paper daffodil or any other flower you fancy. Once you've completed it why not share it with us @NTSpekeHall?

Materials:

- A piece of A4 yellow card
- A small piece of green card
- A yellow or orange mini fairy cake case (coloured paper can be used as an alternative)
- Colouring crayons
- Glue stick
- Sellotape
- Lollipop stick or any other stick you have handy

1. Draw a simple flower shape on yellow card (you can always decorate white card). Make sure you can fit your cake case in the centre. Then ask for help to cut the flower out.



2. Take your cut out flower and decorate it in any way you like. Why not design your own new species of daffodil or flower?



3. Turn your flower over so the decorated side is face down, position your stick and Sellotape it to the back.



4. Turn your flower back over and use the glue stick to apply a circular patch of glue in the middle of your flower. Stick down your fairy cake case, be careful not to crush the sides.

If you don't have a cake case, use a circular piece of orange paper or card.



5. Draw a leaf shape on the green card (see photo), ask an adult for help and cut it out.



Use the glue to stick your leaf to the bottom of the stick. **You're finished, well done!**
