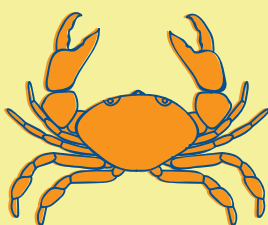


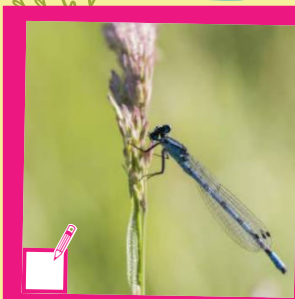
Be a National Trust nature detective

Dragonfly Have you seen a dragonfly go past?



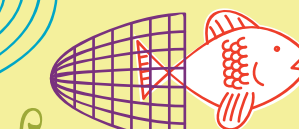
Catkins Can you spot these hanging from trees?



Budding leaves Look for leaves emerging out of buds on the trees - spring is here!



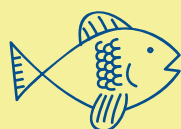
Caterpillars Caterpillars come in all sorts of colours. What colours can you find?

Where should we start our adventure?
