

### National Trust Wicken Fen People's Landscape photography competition rules

1. This competition is open to all residents of the UK, except for employees of the National Trust, their families, or anyone else associated with this competition.
2. All information detailing how to enter this competition forms part of these terms and conditions. It is a condition of entry that all terms and conditions are adhered to. Submission of an entry will be taken to mean acceptance of these terms and conditions.
3. The judges' decisions (whether in relation to determining any shortlists, runners up, or winners) are final. No correspondence will be entered into regarding such decisions.
4. There will be two categories: digital camera and smartphone.
  - a) Digital entries should be submitted via email to: [wickenfen@nationaltrust.org.uk](mailto:wickenfen@nationaltrust.org.uk) only, using the subject line 'People's landscape photography competition'. Image files from digital cameras must be a landscape image, a minimum of 300 dpi and 4000 pixels in length as compressed jpeg file of maximum 10Mb. The email must supply entrant's name, email address, where the image was taken, and explain for each image how it connects people with the landscape.
  - b) Images taken on smartphones can be portrait or landscape and should be posted on Instagram or Twitter using the hashtag #PeoplesWickenFen. The post should explain how the image connects people with the landscape.
  - c) A maximum of one image per month may be submitted.
5. All entries must be received by 23:59 on the last day of each month to be considered for each month's shortlist. The competition will close at 23:59 on 31 December 2019, and the overall winner for each category announced in January 2020. Late entries or entries not explaining how the image connects people with the landscape will not be accepted.
6. Entrants under the age of 16 must obtain the consent of a parent or guardian prior to submitting any images, and confirm this in their submission email, or in the case of smartphone entries by direct message to our Instagram or Twitter @wickenfennt.
7. All images submitted must be the work of the individual submitting them and must not have been published elsewhere (excluding social media) or have won a prize in any other photographic competition
8. The pictures must be taken on National Trust land at Wicken Fen.
9. It is the responsibility of each entrant to ensure that any images they submit have been taken with the consent of anyone who is identifiable, or owns any property, in that image or the consent of their parent/guardian if they are under 16 and that they have been advised of the purpose of the submission and that their photograph may be published by the National Trust. Should the image be shortlisted, you will be contacted to provide a written consent for use by the individual (or parent). The photograph can only go through to judging for the shortlist with this consent.
10. Entrants must ensure that the photographs they are submitting are their own work, that they own the copyright for them and that they do not infringe the copyright or other rights of any third party or any laws.
11. Entrants will retain copyright and moral rights in their submitted images however, by entering, all entrants:
  - a) Grant the National Trust non-exclusive rights to use the images on their website and social media channels

- b) Agree that use of the images referred to in Clause 11(a) above may include publishing, displaying or otherwise reproducing the images
12. The National Trust will endeavour to credit the photographer whenever his or her image is used and published by the National Trust.
  13. The judging for the Wicken Fen People's Landscape competition will be to determine the most visually appealing image for each category that embodies a connection between people and the National Trust's Wicken Fen landscape, as explained by the entrant in their entry email.
  14. The winner for each category will be notified by email for digital entrants or by direct message for smartphone entrants, in January 2020. A list of the winners and runners-up will be on the National Trust website's Wicken Fen page. If a winner cannot be contacted or is not available, the National Trust reserves the right to select the first runner-up from the remaining shortlisted entries as the winner.
  15. The overall winner for each category will receive a voucher for a family boat trip, to be booked during the 2020 season. This prize is non-transferable and there are no cash alternatives.
  16. The winners may be asked to take part in publicity and their name and county may be published on the National Trust website, in National Trust publications, and wider media reporting on the competition.
  17. Events may occur that render the competition itself or the awarding of prizes impossible due to reasons beyond the control of the National Trust and accordingly the National Trust may at its absolute discretion vary or amend the promotion, and the entrant agrees that no liability shall attach to the promoter as a result thereof.
  18. English law applies and the exclusive jurisdiction of the English Courts shall prevail.
